

From our Patron

It is pleasing to report that 2022 has seen our community working towards a graded return to more confidence in social interaction, following the isolation and fear of the Covid -19 pandemic.

During this life-changing period we have seen some notable adjustments to the Stand Like Stone Foundation. Our CEO Anne Kerr left us at the end of 2021. Her talent in helping us settle into our new office in an organised manner in what were extremely difficult times, when working from home became the norm, made her task unique. We are indebted to her for the organisation and running of Stand Like Stone during her time with us and we wish her well in her next endeavours.

Roger Babolka accepted the position of CEO during the difficult pandemic quarantine period and coped admirably with learning to work with the board under "Zoom" conditions. It is pleasing to see that isolation positioning has now nearly ended although our regional disposition makes some internet attendance a necessity on some occasions. We must not lose the effect of a good "round table" discussion to gather whole committee thinking on regular intervals.

Our collaboration with OneFortyOne has seen us continue to make valuable grants across the community and we have also made some useful grants and scholarships from Stand Like Stone Foundation as well, despite the continuing low interest rates we are able to draw on. Our community continues to recognise local pockets of difficulty and seeks to dispel them as much as they are able. For this we thank them and urge their ongoing support for the Stand Like Stone Foundation across the Limestone Coast Region.

Our Patron and Founding Donor, Brian Page, passed away on 16th August 2022. His work with the Area Consultative Committee of the Limestone Coast led into the preliminary discussion about the feasibility of establishing a plan and funding to establish a regional community foundation. Much work was done both in the region and among other community foundations both in Australia and overseas. Brian never forgot his passion for establishing a means to demonstrate confidence and compassion in our community and it was this that led he and his wife, Sue, to make the founding donation to the Stand Like Stone Foundation, with many more to follow. He served as a director on the board for many years and continued as a member of the Rolling Stones group of retired board members and friends after relinquishing his board position. His belief and passion for the Foundation will be sorely missed as we remember his tireless assistance and deep understanding of his community.

The annual "Swinging with the Stars" proved very successful once again. I have attended every one of these events and never ceased to be amazed by the commitment shown by the dancers and the way they share the growing awareness of the foundation and their community. We have been lucky that the pandemic has only postponed one of these events for us.

Now we must continue to build our community, strong in the knowledge that it is a caring and sharing community, recognising its strengths and diversity while seeking to offer a hand-up to those who may use it – truly in the words of Adam Lindsay Gordon, "kindness in another's trouble, courage in our own".

From our Chair

The Stand Like Stone Foundation has again continued to prove its relevance and value to the Limestone Coast community throughout the 2021/22 period.

Like the rest of the country, the Foundation had to persist with living in a Covid -19 environment over the last 12months, but to the credit of all concerned, we continued to provide tangible support across our wonderful region. With our capital base currently sitting at around \$5million, we have continued to provide vital support to those in need. With the guidance and support of our external investment advisory professionals, JB Were Limited and Warakirri Asset Management, our capital base continues to generate strong returns which enables the Foundation to help individuals and community groups with the vital financial support needed.

This year we said farewell to one of our Directors, Di Ind, who was certainly very passionate about the Foundation and was a valuable contributor to the operations. Additionally, we also said farewell to our CEO Anne Kerr in December. During Anne's time with Stand Like Stone, her enthusiasm and drive to improve the Foundation's internal systems and controls will be a lasting legacy to her time here with us. We know that both Di and Anne will continue to be strong advocates for the Foundation, and we thank them for their contributions.

However, we have been fortunate enough to gain the services of Roger Babolka as the Foundation's new CEO. Roger comes to us with a strong background in financial management, business development and has worked at executive levels in the private sector, local government and not-for-profit organisations in the Limestone Coast.

The recent passing of two strong supporters of Stand Like Stone during the year was extremely sad news for all. Neil Balnaves established the Balnaves Fdn scholarship sub fund in 2015, which has supported young people, the disadvantaged and indigenous communities in the region. Brian Page, who was an integral part of Stand Like Stone from the very beginning, was our inaugural donor and Patron at the time of his passing, was a big part of the success and effectiveness of the Foundation and was always there to help out where-ever he could. Brian was always up for chat and would quite often drop into the office and run errands for the staff if needed. He was one-of-a-kind and will be greatly missed by all of us.

Once again, we have been strongly supported by both OneFortyOne and the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal, which has enabled Stand Like Stone to continue to provide support for community projects as well as the ever important 'Back to School' vouchers for families across our region.

We welcomed the announcement from the Federal budget earlier this year with regards to charitable foundations and changes in relation to Deductible Gift Recipient rules. Until now DGR rules have meant that community foundations such as Stand Like Stone can only receive tax deductible donations if they have a Public Ancillary Fund, known as an Item 2 DGR, which we do. However, this current arrangement has restricted how we distribute funding. Although we're yet to see the final details of the new ruling, we're hopeful it will enable greater flexibility and therefore enable the Foundation to achieve more within our community. This change has been a focus of the Foundation since the beginning, but we must place on record our appreciation to the Federal Member for Barker Tony Pasin, backed by Bill DeGaris as he has been instrumental in these changes coming to fruition.

To all our sponsors and supporting partners, City of Mount Gambier, Noel Barr Toyota, OneFortyOne, Ray Scott Pastoral, Tatiara District Council, Wattle Range Council, District Council of Grant, District Council of Robe, Kingston District Council, Naracoorte Lucindale Council, Sinclair Wilson, Galpins, Hello Friday, Green Triangle Electronics, Aussie Broadband and Gabriel Electrical, we thank you for ongoing support and certainly appreciate all that you do for us each year.

We have a wonderful Board with a great variety of skills and attributes, who contribute in many ways to strengthen Stand Like Stone. They truly represent the entire Limestone Coast geographically and contribute well to our planning, risk management and stewardship of our capital base. I'd like to thank all our Board members, members of the various sub-committees, our wonderful staff and all who have supported the Foundation in any way throughout the year.

Thankfully we were able to hold our major fundraising event Swinging with the Stars in 2022, which was once again a spectacular success. With over 500 attending The Barn in June to watch 8 local stars and their dance partners from Hype Studio strut their stuff, it was a very clear reflection of the tremendous dedication and efforts by many. We also take this time to thank all those who supported our stars with generous donations, sponsorship, in-kind support and encouragement.

Operating within the Covid-19 environment created challenges for everyone throughout the community, and it was certainly no different for Stand Like Stone. However, thanks to our many supporters, we were able to continue to provide assistance across the Limestone Coast, through our scholarships, community grants and over 900 'Back to School' vouchers to 40 schools across the region.

However, there is no doubt that both Neil and Brian's contribution to Stand Like Stone will never be lost and we are truly honoured to have had these two individuals as part of the Stand Like Stone community. It would be amiss of me if I did not take this opportunity to thank my predecessor, Anne Kerr, who led the Foundation during the first half of the year. I am very grateful for the advice and support Anne provided to me when I was considering the CEO role, and I know Anne continues to be a strong supporter of the Foundation and we certainly wish her well for the future.

Finally, it's also important to take this time to thank all those who have contributed to the operation of the Foundation over the last 12months. So, to all our Board members, the dedicated staff Sally Bailey and Carissa Wood, our funding partners, our fantastic financial and in-kind sponsors, all those who have donated to the Foundation during the year, the local media who help us get our messages out and the many supporters who help us spread the word, thank you for your efforts and ongoing support. 

A tribute to our Patron, Mr Brian Page

Tribute delivered in Federal Parliament on September 8th, 2022 by Tony Pasin MP, Member for Barker.

I rise to pay tribute to a true gentleman and pillar of the Limestone Coast community, Mr Brian Page. Brian was Mount Gambier through and through. His breadth of knowledge of all things south-east is probably unmatched.

Brian was a forestry professional and founding member of the Mount Gambier Hoo-Hoo branch, the Fraternal Order of the Forest Products Industry, serving as president in 1978; a member of the Mount Gambier Club; a member of the Limestone Coast Area Consultative Committee since its inception in 1995; and a member of the Australian Institute of Wood Science. He worked tirelessly for the local tourism industry, including serving on the Riddoch Art Gallery Foundation as one of the original trustees, chairman of the Limestone Coast Tourism Board and the committee chairman of the Lady Nelson establishment body.

But Brian was probably perhaps best known for his philanthropy. Brian was a member of the Stand Like Stone Foundation board of directors since its inception in 2004 and was the inaugural chair of the interim steering committee for the community foundation project. Brian and his wife Sue were also founding donors and, through Stand Like Stone, established scholarships for students at Mount Gambier High School, Kingston Community School and Keith Area School.

Brian's belief of community-based philanthropy has served our community in the Limestone Coast well. Brian joined myself and many others in pushing for the federal government to reform tax deductible gift recipient rules, as Brian believed strongly, as I do, in the community foundation model and the premise that locally collected charitable donations were best spent on the local communities and that a long-term sustainable approach to giving was the only way to combat long-term entrenched community problems. Brian worked tirelessly for a more generous and inclusive community. He did it quietly, without seeking personal accolade. Brian's generosity, his kindness, his knowledge and his love for the south-east are what he will be fondly remembered for by many.

Mount Gambier and, indeed, the wider south-east have

lost a great man but have benefited immensely from his lifelong commitment and dedication to community throughout his life. As we reflect on Brian's life, let us be inspired to be more like him, if only in part, and give back to the community that supports so many. My sincerest condolences to Brian's wife Sue, his extended family and his many friends.

OneFortyOne Community Grants

We are proud to continue working with OneFortyOne, and thanks to their generous funding, we have been able to provide another \$50,000 in grants to a variety of regional projects.

This is the 9th year of our partnership with OneFortyOne, which has resulted in a further 3 very important projects, taking the tally of these grants to more than \$300,000 over the 9 years." OneFortyOne is a major forest grower and sawmilling company, employing over 350 people in the Limestone Coast region. The Jubilee Sawmill is one of the most modern and progressive sawmills in Australia, manufacturing a range of timber products such as structural timber, decking and posts, which are used in the construction and agricultural sectors.

OneFortyOne operations are an integral part of our regional communities and continues to invest in supporting the local environment and local people.

We are again delighted to continue to support a group of young Limestone Coast leaders, auspicing funds on their behalf from the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR) ABC Heywire Youth Innovation Grants program.

The "Let's talk about (Dis)ability" project is a program targeting Year 4 to 10 students in Mount Gambier and Penola and involves a presentation by speakers with lived experience as well as disability-related simulations.

The project is aimed at raising awareness and an understanding that just because this person has a certain illness or disability, it does not mean they are confined to that as an identity. We are thrilled to continue to support such a fabulous group of young people who want to raise awareness and educate others on disability, accessibility and inclusion in the Limestone Coast.

Keith RSL Hardships of War Scholarships

This scholarship was established following a generous bequest from a Keith RSL member's estate and is awarded annually to Year 7 students at the Keith Area School.

In the early 2000s, the ever-dwindling WW2 members of the Keith RSL Sub-Branch donated \$10,000 to Stand Like Stone. The income generated from the donation funds an annual award for Year 7 students at the Keith Area School to research family service history.

We are honoured to continue partnering with the Keith RSL sub-branch to allocate the funding and were able to provide \$167 towards the scholarships this year.

FRRR Back to School Program

Thanks to a funding partnership with the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal, as well as contributions from generous private donors, we have been able to support many local families right across the region with the costs of going back to school.

This year we have distributed 920 x \$50 vouchers to 40 local schools across the Limestone Coast.

Families use these vouchers to help with the costs of purchasing uniforms, books, stationary or whatever supplies might be needed for a new school year.

We know this program is one of our most meaningful ones, making a real difference to families right across the region. It is more than just a \$50 gift.

It's a way for every child to return to school with dignity, to fit in with their peers and have the same sense of excitement that comes with a new lunch bag, or a pair of shoes, or pencil case and drink bottle at the start of a new year.

Stay at School Program

We are proud to continue partnering with the Wyatt Trust for the Stay at School program, helping independent learning students in Year 11 and 12 with the costs of education. Participating students received a financial gift of up to \$500, which not only helps to alleviate some of the financial pressure for an independently living High School student, but it also helps these students know that people in their community care and want to help them succeed.

The Rackhams Educational Scholarship Sub Fund was established in 2019. This Sub Fund supports 2 \times \$10,000 scholarships to students each year from the Wattle Range Council area, and 1 \times \$10,000 scholarship to a student with a connection to the Limestone Coast. Additional funds are also donated annually for the purpose of enabling scholarships in perpetuity.





Investment Performance


Our funds are professionally managed by two leading investment companies, JB Were and Warakirri.
